

The Glasgow Board of Education took some steps last night to prepare for any reduction in funding that may be coming the district's way. Not all of the facts are yet known as far as funding cuts to come, but Finance Officer Sue Furlong told the board last night that

2 big cuts they do know about are the "Seek" funding from the State and the cut in federal funding due to "Sequestration:
