

William "Bill" Key, age 69 of Bowling Green, died Friday surrounded by his loving family after a courageous battle with cancer at the Hospice Center of Southern Kentucky. The Barren Count Native was a U.S. Army Veteran. He served three years in Alaska as a Communications Specialist. He later served as a Police Officer in Cave City and Glasgow.
