August 2, 1990 – Kasey Goodman and Ashley Kingrey, sophomores at Glasgow High School were named All Star Cheerleaders at Summer Camp.

August 3, 1990 – Tommy Matthews is sworn in as 4th District Magistrate replacing Woody Strader who resigned to accept the position of Supervisor of the Barren County Road Department.

August 5, 1990 – Nancy Botts is appointed Barren County Circuit Court Clerk following the death of Bobby Wilson.

August 7, 1990 – AD – Buying Junk Cars \$50.00 a ton at Barren County Scrap.

August 9, 1990 – Marine League Scholarship winners are Beth Stice, Julie Nelson, John Yates, and Tim Cash.

August 13, 1990 – A ribbon cutting was held for the grand opening of the Family Restaurant at 410 E. College Street. The restaurant is owned and operated by Milton and Agatha Sublett.

August 15, 1990 – SKF Bearings in Glasgow announced a \$70 million expansion here in Glasgow.
