November 2, 1970 – The school bond is the biggest local issue in tomorrow's local election. A proposed tax levy of 5 cents to 15 cents per hundred of assessed valuation is being asked for to finance a new Barren County Central High School. (Bond issue was defeated 1396 to 1169, a 227 vote difference.)

November 3, 1970 – 12 deluxe cottages are under construction at Barren River State Park, with an average cost of each cottage being around \$32,000.

November 5, 1970 – John R. Gray is the manager for JC Penney's replacing Al Hawks, who was transferred to Mt. Airy, NC.
